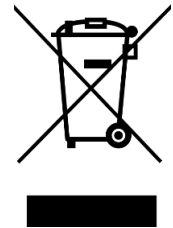
WEEE STATEMENT

Background

The EU Directive 2002/96/EC became law in the UK on the 2nd January, 2007. Its primary purpose is the prevention of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) and requires the re-use, recycling and recovery of such waste, so as to reduce its disposal to landfill or incineration. All electrical and electronic waste must be stored, collected, treated, recycled and disposed of separately from other waste.

Disposal of Instro products with WEEE Labels

Instro Precision fully endorses the environmental objectives of the WEEE Directive and all Instro Precision Limited electronic products are labelled with the WEEE symbol, to alert our customers to the fact these products should not be disposed of with general refuse, i.e. in a landfill site, or with municipal or household waste. All electronic products with the WEEE logo must be collected and sent to approved operators for safe disposal or recycling.

As a producer of non-household electrical and electronic equipment (EEE), and in order to fulfil our WEEE obligations, Instro Precision Limited has registered with one of UK's largest WEEE Producer Compliance Scheme.
